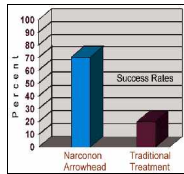

The Narconon® Drug Rehabilitation Program Resolves Drug Cravings.

While drugs and their metabolites quickly become undetectable in blood and urine, some as rapidly as 3 days after last usage, drug metabolites remain stored in fatty tissues for years. When fats are metabolized during times of stress or exercise, the drug residuals are mobilized as well. This may lead to reactivation of drug effects, a "flashback" type experience or, in the case of the recovering drug abuser, this may lead to reactivation of the craving for the original drug of choice.

The New Life Detoxification Program utilizes a combination of exercise, induced sweating in a sauna, and nutritional supplements to produce the following results:

- Reduction or elimination of drug and alcohol cravings.
- Reduction or elimination of many symptoms associated with drug addiction and alcoholism. These can include depression, irritability, and fatigue.

The overall goal of the Narconon Drug Rehabilitation program is to fully rehabilitate drug and/or alcohol abusers so that they are free of drugs and able to achieve their goals.

What is a drug?

In medical terms, a drug is any substance that when taken into a living organism may modify one or more of its functions. Drugs can provide temporary relief from unhealthy symptoms and/or permanently supply the body with a necessary substance the body can no longer make. Some drugs produce unwanted side effects. Some drugs lead to an unhealthy dependency that has both physiological and behavioral roots.

How do drugs affect the mind?

The mind is our most important tool. Drugs do several things that harm one's ability to think or to be fully aware of the present surroundings. These effects continue long after the effects of the drug appear to have worn off.

Addictive drugs activate the brain's reward systems. The promise of reward is very intense, causing the individual to crave the drug and to focus his/her activities on getting and taking the drug.

Studies and Results of the Narconon Program

Evaluation of the Narconon program results has been ongoing for more than a quarter of a century, studies have found that, on average, three out of four Narconon graduates remain stably drug-free over two years after program completion. Reduction in criminal recidivism is as remarkable.

"A recent outcome study examined 123 Narconon program graduates. Prior to their participation in the program, 81% had been incarcerated, 33% for longer than one month. 22% admitted to engaging in criminal activity for an average of 13 of the 30 days prior to starting the Narconon program. 18 months after graduation, average days incarcerated for those interviewed was less than 0.05."
